There will be no increase for the 2012 Home Owners Associa-(HOA) dues. tion Home owners who are delinquent in paying their (HOA) dues can expect to see a more aggressive approach to collections. In 2012 the HOA Board has agreed to pursue more aggressive approaches in collecting delinquent dues. We are going to do everything legally possible to collect those monies owed to our HOA by following using the methods of collection:

1. Obtaining legal judgments and liens against the properties with de-

linquent accounts so that those monies will have to be paid during the sale or refinancing of properties.

2. Using those same judgments to garnish the wages and/or bank accounts of home owners who refuse to pay court ordered judgments.

3. As a last resort, pursuing foreclosures on these properties.

Pursuing any of these efforts is not our preference, because we understand the financial challenges families are facing these days. However, our failure to do so may results in increased dues in order to meet our financial obligations. It is only fair that we all pay our fair share. So let this information serve as a notice that these efforts are forthcoming.

The management firm has agreed to accept partial payment of dues at anytime throughout the year to enhance our efforts in this process. So please take advantage of that option and consider making arrangements to get current by January 1, 2012.

Protecting Your Home From Fire

According to the home Safety Council, the third leading cause of unintentional home injury and related deaths is caused by fire and burns. Here are some Fire Safety Tips to talk about with your family and put into action now:

- Always stay in the kitchen while cooking
- Store matches and lighters in a locked cabinet, out of reach of young children
- Keep things that can burn away from your fireplace

- Keep grills at least 10 feet away from other objects
- If you or someone in house smokes, use large, deep ashtrays on sturdy surfaces
- Blow out candles when adults leave the room
- Store gasoline outside
- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home and in every bedroom and practice family fire drills at least twice annually
- Make a fire escape plan for your family. Very important if you

have young children

- Teach your family to "Stop, Drop, Roll and Cool" if clothes catch on fire by dropping immediately to the ground, crossing hands over your chest and rolling over and over or back and forth to put out the flames. Cool the burned area with cool water and seek medical attention for serious burns.
- Consider having a fire extinguisher. Consider storing them in multiple places around the house.

Bartlett New Prescription Discount Card

The City of Bartlett has a new program to offer savings on prescription drugs to residents who are without health insurance, a traditional benefits plan, or have prescriptions that are not covered by insurance. The Prescription Discount Card is made available to residents by the City of Bartlett in collaboration with the National League of Cities (NLC) and is made possible through the City of Bartlett residents, regardless of age, income or existing health

insurance. By using this card you may save an average of 20% off the regular retail price of prescription drugs at participating pharmacies. Residents may also pick up a card at the City of Bartlett, Office of Citizen Services, City Hall Annex, 6382 Stage Road. Or for more information, call toll free 1-888-620-1749.

This is not insurance. Discounts are only available at Participating pharmacies. By using this card, participants agree to pay the entire

Prescription costs less any applicable discount. Savings may vary by drug pharmacy.
